

## **Message From the Head of School**

### **Dear Parents and Carers,**

A very warm welcome or welcome back as we look all set to embark on what looks destined to be a very exciting Term 3 here at Woodford. I hope that any of you who managed a holiday over the past few weeks have had a relaxing time and are not over keen to send your kids back to school. Regardless the teachers are back and certainly well prepared for the term ahead. So that you are able to keep you abreast of the various goings on at the school I offer the following notes for your perusal.

### **Staffing:**

Following the three late resignations in PE /Middle Years Leadership, English as an Additional Language and Individual Needs I am pleased to inform you of the following appointments. I also extend a warm welcome to our new employees.

- EAL – We have appointed Meri Porowai. Meri has spent most of her life in the Solomon Islands and is very well known locally for her conscientious and effective work in various EAL and administrative roles. Meri is originally from the UK but after a short spell in Australia moved to the Solomon Island where a short stay has now become 45 years.
- Special Ed. –We have appointed Alice Rore to take on the Individual Needs role at the School. Alice has a Bachelor of Education degree and a Masters degree in Linguistics. She has just returned to her Solomon Island home after teaching for 8 years in USP, Suva Fiji and we are more than happy to see her back.
- PE - I am also very excited to announce that we have now appointed an experienced teacher/administrator and all round sportsman as our PE specialist. He will join us next term after fulfilling his current contract conditions.
- Middle Years Coordinator role. I have advertised internally for a temporary/interim appointment and hope to conduct interviews this week.

### **Building Works:**

In spite of our best intentions the toilet and shower renovations on the Breezeway are not yet completed. We are following this up as a matter of urgency with the contractor. Our own maintenance team have though made substantial progress on the Library/Media Centre and the emergency stairs from building A are completed ready for testing.

## **Robotics**

We are proud to announce that four students from Woodford International School have been selected to represent Solomon Islands in 2018 First Global Robotics Competition in Mexico City.

The FIRST Global Challenge is a truly international robotics event with more than 175 nations across the world traveling to Mexico City to participate. Participating teams are composed of students – aged 14 through 18 years – with the common goal of increasing their knowledge of Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics (STEM) so that they can become the next generation of scientific leaders who will work together to solve some of the world's most pressing problems, from food security and access to clean water, to finding better medicines and securing cyberspace. The Challenge will take place from August 15-18, 2018 at the Arena Ciudad de México. The theme for 2018 is “Energy Impact” From commonly used fossil fuels to environmentally friendly resources like solar and wind, energy is a tool that powers the different parts of our world one way or another. In the 2018 FIRST Global Challenge, shifting alliances of three nations will compete to fuel power plants, initiate renewable energy plants, and build a resilient transmission network.
